OLD BOY ORDAINED

On Saturday 17th September Old Boy Daniel Kelly (2000) was ordained as a priest by the Bishop at St Helen's Church, Westcliff.

The church was so full that an overflow facility with a video link had to be set-up in the Baptist church across the road to ensure that everyone who wished to be there could be accommodated.

Approximately 50 priests concelebrated and both Frank Keenan and Peter Travis were in the congregation to represent the school as past and present headmasters.

Daniel, who also attended Sacred Heart Primary School, had been a parishioner at St Helen's for many years having been an altar server there whilst at senior school.

After leaving St Thomas More he spent a year working at the Royal Bank of Scotland before attending Heythrop College, University of London where he gained a degree in Theology for Ministry. He then spent a further year working for various companies in the City to gain further experience in the secular world before joining St John's seminary at Wonersh to train for the Priesthood, where he also gained an MA in Bioethics.

We wish Daniel every success and enjoyment in his vocation and are delighted to report that he has accepted the President's invitation to become the Association Chaplain.

As many members will be aware, the school celebrated its 50th anniversary throughout the school year 2010-2011.

These celebrations reached their climax on 14th July when the Bishop visited to preside at the annual St Thomas More Day Mass (moved from the actual feast day of 22nd June).

Nine priests from the deanery (and one visiting from Africa) concelebrated with the Bishop and Old Boy Daniel Kelly performed the duties of Deacon at the Mass which was celebrated with the entire school in the Sports Hall.



This esteemed Association was further represented by past Head of R.E. and Deputy Headmaster David Finnigan who was Master of Ceremonies, as well as our President Paul Driscoll, Membership Secretary Liam Rand and past teacher members Tom Mayhew,



John Askew and David Milne.



A special attraction was the presence of a hat actually worn by our patron', which had been kindly loaned by an historical society.

After the Mass the guests all retired to the

school hall for a lavish buffet lunch at which the Bishop, who had been a curate in Westcliff in the early 1960s, praised the school for its many achievements and traditions.



Whilst the great and the good were tucking in with gusto, the pupils themselves were enjoying burgers and hot dogs on the school field and participating in various activities including rock climbing,

bouncy castles and inflatable combat games all accompanied by a steel band.



The cost of this lavish, once every half- century, entertainment opportunity was met largely by a donation from the Parents' Association, but we are delighted to report that this Association also donated £500 to help meet the very considerable costs incurred.

2010/11 SCHOOL REPORT

So, how is the old place doing now that we've left? A frequently asked/thought question amongst members. Well, dear reader, this intrepid publication has obtained a report from the school on the examination and sporting successes of the past academic year. Read on....

The GCSE results overall were above the national average, with many impressive individual results:-

Five or more $A^*-C = 73\%$ Five or more A^*-C including English and Maths = 61%

Five or more A*-G including English and Maths = 99%

The 6th Form students also achieved a record high A^* -E Pass Rate last year of **99.7%**, with similarly impressive results of A^* -C, **69%** and A^* -B, **33.6%**.

As a result of these examination successes, the vast majority of STM students who applied for places at university were successful, which is pretty impressive given the increasingly competitive nature of university entrance.

SPORTS

Once again, the school has enjoyed great success on the sporting field which does so much to promote its good name in the Community. Steve Harrison

continues to defy the effects of aging in leading a dedicated team of teachers who, between them, coached, cajoled and managed the pupils to the following successes in 2010/11:-

In football, Years 7, 9 and 10 all won both their leagues and Southend Cups, with Year 10 also winning the South East Essex Cup. Year 8 finished as runnersup in their league and Year 9 did the same in the South East Essex Cup. Both Years 8 and 11 managed to reach the semi-finals of both cup competitions, with Year 7 doing the same in the South East Essex Cup. Clearly the old place is to be feared on the football pitch!

The senior years in the school also continued to shine in **basketball** with Years 9, 10 and 11 all finishing in second place in their leagues. Year 9 also finished as runners-up in their cup final, whilst Year 11 reached the semi-finals.

The hockey players in Years 10/11 won the Essex Cup Plate, whilst the senior badminton players finished as Borough champions, with the juniors being runnersup in their league.

Finally, the school year ended well with the Years 9 and 10 **cricket** teams both finishing as runners-up in both the Borough League and the South East Essex Cup.

So, all-in-all a year full of accomplishments both academic and sporting! Long may it continue.
