the fashion statement it is for those of us who own one).

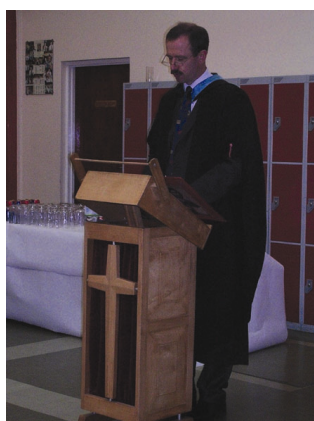

On Friday 23rd June we, once again, held our traditional Old Boys' Memorial Mass to commemorate the deceased pupils and staff of the school.

This year, however, the occasion was made even more poignant than usual by the recent death of



former Headmaster Don McGregor who had died earlier that week.

Special remembrance was made of him and David Finnigan (who had known him since he became

Headmaster in 1964) delivered a sober, yet amusing, eulogy at the end of the liturgy.
