IT'S TIME FOR A CHANGE!!


After three years of dedicated service our esteemed President, Paul Hutchinson, has decided that it is time to stand down from his exalted position and hand over the reins to someone else.

BLAST FROM THE PAST

Continuing our series of extracts taken from the original school logbooks, we rejoin the entries in September 1978...

From then on the entries become little more than a record of staff arrivals and departures with the occasional major event receiving a mention.

5th September 1978 saw the start of the next school year and the new staff joining were Mrs Smith (Remedial & Art), Mr Dugan (RE & History), Mr Neilson (Science) and Mr Gwilliam (Geography & Social Studies).

The following school year began on 6th September 1979 with Mrs Ballard (Remedial), Mr Galvin Studies), (Social Rawcliffe (Social Studies) and Mrs Parmenter (Maths Science) beginning their time at the school.

Times were beginning to change and the school seemed to be broadening its horizons as far as trips were concerned. On 8th December a number of 4th Year pupils (Year 10 in new money) departed for a two week cruise of the Mediterranean on the SS Uganda (2 years later to become a hospital ship in the Falklands conflict) and on 12th April the first school ski trip took place.

Being the school's twentieth anniversary, 1980 saw a number of special events including the first Old Boys' Mass and an Old Boys' play (*The Front Page*) directed by David Milne and Tom Kennedy.

At the end of the school year Mr Dugan and Mr Edwards left.

The new school year began on September 6th with four new members of staff: Mr Edmunds (Craft, Design Technology), Mr O'Keefe (Head of the Remedial Ifor the benefit younger members, now called Special Needs - Ed] Department), Mr Brindle-Selle (Geography & Social Studies) and Mrs Gurney (General Studies).

Unusually for STM the Prizegiving ceremony seems to have been held on 10th October (presumably for the previous school year) and the presentations were made by Dr Anthony McDermott - an Old Boy!

Later that school-year the school's equilibrium was rocked by the resignation on 2nd March of Don McGregor as Headmaster after 17 years at the helm. He left at the end of that term on 10th April, and at the same time Mr Thompson (Maths) retired.

Things moved fast in those days and Tony McDonald was appointed replacement Headmaster on only 28th April. He was officially inducted as Headmaster on 23rd July.

The end of that particularly bumpy school

year was also soured by the death on 25th June of Mr Charles (Maths).

The new school year, under a new Headmaster, began on 8th September 1981 with a raft of new staff - Mr McDonald (Headmaster), Mr Lebeau (Craft, Design & Technology), Mr HoChee (Maths), Mr Vickers (Maths), Mr Peck (R.E.), Mrs Sekonofsky (parttime), and Mrs Girling.

The new Headmaster introduced the regular weekly newsletter called *Contact* on 11th September (and it is still produced to this day!).

The end of that Christmas term saw the departure of the recently arrived Mr Lebeau and Mrs Sekenofsky.

The new HM must have wondered what he had taken on when on 1st April 1982 the school had to be closed due to toxic fumes emanating from some new cavity wall insulation - The now infamous Urea Formaldehyde episode!

The problem became so severe that the entire school were forced to de-camp to the newly vacated Southchurch Hall High School building for the whole of the next school year!
